Provincial Elections

- Voter registration and polls open February 27, 2015 and close March 22 at 1700. We viewed a demonstration of voting online which presidents will also see at their upcoming meeting.
- Mark Ramsankar has been acclaimed as Provincial ATA President
- There will be an election for **Provincial Vice-Presidents** (2). The following four candidates are running for VP: Greg Jeffery, Myrna McLean, Katherine Pritchard, Robert Twerdoclib

Government

- Annual Representative Assembly (ARA) will debate the **proposed budget** of 1.72% increase, which would increase our fees by twenty-one dollars to \$1245 per annum.
- Alberta Education starting to develop a relationship with the new minister. We continue to press for an SLA as a tool for teachers to use in a rich repertoire of assessment. We do not want this to slip into a practice of analysis of the responses as PATs have. We continue to press on the issue of complexity and diversity in Alberta classrooms.

- Alberta Education Regulatory Review
 Alberta Education is again actively working to develop regulations to support
 implementation of the Education Act. The Regulatory Review Project was overseen by
 a ministerial committee composed of one public member and four members of the
 Legislative Assembly (MLAs), including Maureen Kubinec, MLA for BarrheadMorinville-Westlock, as chair. Recommendations of particular interest to us include –
 home education, private schools, fees, school councils, charter schools.
- Third-Party Study on Teacher Workload Advisory committee Approximately one-third of the Teacher Workload Survey has been completed. Researchers expect to be able to meet the deadline of July 31/15 for submission of the report.
- Provincial Legislature **Spring sitting** will commence March 10

- Canadian Teachers' Federation (CTF): We forwarded 13 candidate names for participation in **Project Overseas 2015.** We provide funding for ten Alberta teachers to participate.
- Media Campaign -Reworking previous commercials with added features for the spring.

Research

- **Digital Reporting and Digital Assessment Tools: Evaluating Their Value and Their Impact** A new research report, Digital Reporting and Digital Assessment
 Tools: Evaluating their Value and their Impact, was recently published. The research
 data show that digital reporting tools are seen as having low value on impacting
 instruction and assessment, yet extremely high impact on workload. See infographic
 at the end of report.
- A specific example of this research students affected by glitches during Part A writing of English 30-1 and -2 last week.
- A new project is underway between Canada and Norway called the NORCAN initiative. This project will focus on the commitment to improve student learning in mathematics informed by the principle of "excellence through equity." The proposed research question for this international partnership is: How can an international network of schools and educators committed to mindful leadership help to identify obstacles to students' mathematics learning and develop strategies for attaining success?

DIGITAL REPORTING & ASSESSMENT TOOLS



Evaluating their impact on classrooms

In Alberta, the use of digital reporting tools (eg, PowerSchool, StudentsAchieve and Desire2Learn) and digital assessment tools (eg, Mathletics, SuccessMaker, DreamBox Learning Math and Raz-Kids) has grown dramatically over the past decade. In 2014, the Alberta Teachers' Association and University of Alberta researchers surveyed over 1,100 teachers and principals from across urban and rural Alberta about the perceived value and impact of these digital tools on instruction and assessment practices, teachers' work life and shifting parental expectations.

Have digital reporting tools facilitated and improved communication with students?




